A MESSAGE FROM A NEW CHURCH MEMBER



Sunday, June 13, 2021, was a very exciting day for me. I became a member of the Lacey United Methodist Church. My husband was the Pastor of Lacey Christian Assembly in Bamber, NJ, for 30 years. I didn't need to look for a church home. I had one. When Covid took John home to be with the Lord, I needed to find a new church home. But of all the churches in Ocean County, how and why did I settle into the Methodist church?

The story starts back in 2012. I had known about LUMC and the move to the old St. Pius building, but why would I go there? I had a church home. Super Storm Sandy changed everything! It destroyed homes and disrupted lives. LUMC jumped into action and the town of Lacey took notice. Meals, supplies and help were offered. Shelter was given to families without a place to stay. I got involved in washing blankets and bedding for the rooms where people stayed. I also had an author who had visited my school the year before donate 25 books with puppets for children who needed such comfort. I smelled wonderful aromas coming from the kitchen and saw tables decorated with pretty flower arrangements when I dropped off the books. That spoke of hope and better times! I imagined weary souls dragging themselves into fellowship hall to be greeted with smiles, kind encouraging words, hot food, and shelves full of supplies that they could take after breakfast, lunch or dinner. I stopped and thought surely this is Jesus in the flesh serving these people.

My one daughter was getting married and we needed a larger church for the wedding. LUMC allowed us to hold the ceremony there. Pastor Linda was gracious enough to allow my husband to officiate the wedding in her church.

I next encountered the church when my granddaughter got involved with the youth group and was chosen to be Mary in their 2018 production of "Three Wise Men and a Baby." The next year, my other granddaughter had a role in "Straight Outta Bethlehem" through the Drama Club. Both of these experiences had a huge impact on my granddaughters. Both shows provided an uplifting holiday experience.

In April 2020, my husband became ill and was taken to the hospital. I reached out to LUMC to put him on the prayer list, as he had developed a relationship with the church over the years. Not only was he put on the prayer list for LUMC, but this church reached out to the churches in Lacey to get everyone praying. Once again, one church stood head and shoulders above all others in my eyes. Pastor Linda called me to talk and pray with me. Pastor Linda prayed with me again after John went home to the Lord. So, when I needed to find a new home church, the search was not too hard. My husband used to tell the congregation to go out and be Jesus with skin on. In LUMC, I have found a group of Christians who are Jesus with skin on to the town and the world.
