ED WOJCIECHOWSKI REFLECTS ON TIME AS LAY LEADER ON LAITY SUNDAY

Grace and peace to you, my brothers and sisters in Christ. This is the day that the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad in it. Today is Laity Sunday and I'd like to take this opportunity to reflect on my service as Lay Leader here at Lacey UMC. As you may or may not know, I will no longer be serving as your Lay Leader come January. However, I'm blessed to continue to serve as your Lay Representative to Annual Conference. And to be a member of Church Council, the Finance Committee and the Staff Parish Relations Committee. I stand before you today with a troubled heart. But in John 14: 1, Jesus says "Do not let your hearts be troubled, you believe in God, believe also in me." It saddens me to witness the division and brokenness in our church. And I wonder if unity and trust can ever be restored? I don't know. But in Matthew 19:26, Jesus says "With man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible." I put my faith and trust in our Lord and Savior. As a Christian and member of the United Methodist Church, I believe and follow the Bible as traditionally interpreted. This belief is upheld by the current United Methodist Book of Discipline. The Greater New Jersey Leadership does not have the same belief and no longer adheres to the current Book of Discipline. And division exists throughout our Annual Conference. When God led me here to Lacey UMC, I was broken and needed Jesus in my life. I acknowledge I am a sinner and admit I am far from perfect. I find comfort and healing in scripture. 2 Cor 5: 17 says "Therefore if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away, behold, all things have become new. I was honored to have the opportunity and privilege to serve as Lay Leader here at Lacey UMC and I believe it was a blessing from God. I give my thanks and praise to God and give all honor and glory to Him. I have always attempted to serve as Lay Leader with honesty and integrity. But, I recognize I have made mistakes along the way. I faithfully served on the various committees I was a member of including SPRC, Nominations, Finance, Church Council and Charge Conference. I attended almost every single meeting. I also attended most of the Trustees meetings and attended all of the Annual and Church Conferences. At times, often sacrificing time with my family and missing some of my grandchildren's sporting events. I am proud of the way I served and make no apologies and have no regrets.

We are in a time of great uncertainty in the United Methodist Church. As a result of the pending separation, our congregation will be faced with some tough choices and difficult decisions. As a Lay Leader, I felt it was extremely important to keep our congregation informed to help us navigate the difficult road ahead and enable us to make educated decisions. All of the information I provided was public information and much of the information supported the current official stance of the United Methodist Church. However, my ability to communicate with the entire congregation was somewhat limited. The New Birth Committee was formed and I became a member. This was definitely a step in the right direction. However, there were still limitations on what I was able to share with the congregation. My only intent was to inform and educate our congregation. I understand we all have different beliefs and opinions. And, I never attempted to influence anybody's decisions or choices.

Personally, I felt it extremely important to share critical information in order to dispel uncertainty and empower people to make good decisions for the future of our church. And since my ability to communicate was restricted as Lay Leader, I chose to share information through my personal email, not as Lay Leader, but as a Christian. As a person, I felt it was my right to do so. Everyone has the same right and everyone who received the information had the choice to read, delete or ignore it. Many people appreciated the information I shared and thanked me. Some people requested to be removed from my email distribution. My only hope was for people to read it with an open mind and perhaps share it.

As a Lay Leader, I became very concerned when informed about personal cameras with both audio and video capabilities installed in our Fellowship Hall without following proper procedures and protocol, and I felt I had an obligation to pursue the issue. I brought the issue to our SPRC committee in order to gather information and determine the appropriate course of action. As a result of my personal emails and my pursuit of this issue, a vote to remove me as Lay Leader was brought before the Charge Conference and I am being replaced. I can't say I was completely surprised. But scripture tells me to speak the truth no matter what the cost. In Galatians 4: 16, the apostle Paul says "Have I now become your enemy because I tell you the truth?" And in Ephesians 4: 15 Paul says "instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of Him, who is the head, that is, Christ." And I will continue to speak and share the truth. I'll close with scripture from 1 John 3: 18: "Friends, let us love, not in words or speech, but in truth and action." God Bless you all.
